Transience – temporality and transformation – is a central theme of Anne Duk Hee Jordan's work. She is particularly interested in the imperceptible (human and non-human) details of life. Her artistic motivations are a curiosity about the impossible and the unthinkable. Jordan experiments with and focuses mainly on phenomena of ecosystems: she uses a visual vocabulary that addresses many different social and ecological issues. Her work incorporates food as a central component and motor of earthly life. Her oeuvre becomes a fictional and experimental universe that reveals itself bit by bit.

Jordan studied at the Weißensee Academy of Art, Berlin and continued with a Master in Fine Arts at the Institut für Raumexperimente, Berlin under Olafur Eliasson.

Recent solo exhibitions include Ziggy on the Land of Drunken Trees, Berlin, Galerie Wedding (2018) Into the Wild, Berlin Food Art Week (2017) and Entanglement of the Little Things, Balzer Projects, Basel (2016).
